INTRODUCTION

Gymnastics Canada (GymCan) is pleased to offer you this document to our Canadian TG Judges to outline the Canadian Judging System, roles, responsibilities and formalities.

CANADIAN JUDGING SYSTEM

A. COURSES AND EXAMS

The following outlines the Provincial and National Judging systems for the sports of Trampoline, Tumbling and Double Mini Trampoline.

- 1. Provincial Judge Course
 - a. The criteria for Provincial level candidates, is the responsibility of each PTO.
 - b. Full course and exam content will be provided by the Judging Chairperson of Canada for each course.

c. Exam Rewrite:

A judge can retry the unsuccessful portion of the exam a maximum of two (2) times. Judges are permitted to complete an exam rewrite no longer than three (3) months after the previous attempt (either three (3) months after the original course or three (3) months after the first rewrite attempt) without taking the complete course. In such cases where a judge is still unsuccessful, the candidate will be required to complete the full course again.

d. Course Schedule:

Scheduling of courses is the responsibility of the Province.

e. Course Conductor Criteria:

- Minimum National 1 judge in the given discipline
- National judging experience in the given discipline

f. Course Conductor Honorarium:

The course conductor honorarium is the responsibility of the Province.

2. National Judge Course

a. Candidate:

- Candidates who Pass the P1-P2 courses and judge at least 3 events following successful completion of the courses.
- National coach who is fully certified level 3 (TG) or higher.
- Athletes that have been named to the Senior National Team
- Previous National or Brevet judge who lost accreditation due to being inactive.
- b. Full course content and exam will be provided by the Judge Chairperson of Canada for each course.

c. Exam Rewrite:

A judge can retry the unsuccessful portion of the exam a maximum of two (2) times. Judges are permitted to complete an exam rewrite no longer than three (3) months after the previous attempt (either three (3) months after the original course or three (3) months after the first rewrite attempt) without taking the complete course. In such cases where a judge is still unsuccessful, the candidate will be required to complete the full course again. If the candidate is unsuccessful in two parts of the exam in a discipline, the full course must be retaken.

d. Course Schedule:

Courses must be given at least once every two (2) years of the current FIG Cycle. Priority will be given for a course given during a National domestic trial. In that situation, all fees related to the course conductor will be covered by GymCan. A Province is permitted to host a National course by making a request to the Judging Chairperson of Canada. If granted approval, the Province is responsible for all expenses related to the Course conductor, except for the Honorarium cost, which would be paid by GymCan. In either case, registration fees are collected by GymCan.

e. Course Conductor Criteria:

- FIG judge who has attend the Intercontinental course in the current cycle for at least one (1) TG discipline
- Current FIG judge in the discipline of the course given
- Previous experience in giving a Provincial Judge course

NOTE: If it is not possible to fulfill the first criterion (attending the Intercontinental course), a request can be submitted to the Judging Chairperson of Canada for a judge that is a current FIG 3 or better in the appropriate discipline.

f. Course Conductor Honorarium: (includes course preparation, exam correction)

i.	1 Discipline (1 day):	\$280.00

g. Course Fees

NOTE: In order to host a National Judging Course, there must be minimum of 5 participants. Maximum number of registrants is 9.



3. International Judge Course

Candidate:

National 1 judge with experience judging at eight (8) National domestic events. The candidate is required to be recommend by the Judge Chairperson of Canada The process may be fast tracked for a FIG 3 Brevet Coach, if they have previously passed the National course and examinations and is recommended by the Judge Chairperson of Canada.

4. Intercontinental Judge course

Candidate:

FIG 3 Judge that has completed at least one cycle at the FIG level. The candidate is required to be recommend by the Judge Chairperson of Canada.

B. ACTIVE JUDGING REQUIREMENTS

Requirements to be an Active Judge

a. Provincial Level:

The requirements to be active as a judge are the responsibility of each Province.

- b. National Level: must be a member-in-good standing with both the Provincial and National Federations.
 - i. Successfully complete the recertification for the current FIG Cycle
 - ii. Completed Enhanced Background Check, Canada-wide and/or International Police Checks valid at the time of the competition
 - iii. Complete "Respect In Sport" online e-learning module package

C. JUDGING ASSIGMENT SELECTION PROCEDURE

1. Assignment Process

- A FIG council judge will be in attendance at all domestic National events and will act as the superior judge.
- National level 3 is eligible to judge athletes in Levels 5 to 7 at a National event. N3 judges are also eligible to judge Trampoline Horizontal Displacement for Junior and Senior categories.
- National level 2 is eligible to judge athletes in Levels 5 to Junior at a National event. N2 judges are eligible to judge Trampoline Horizontal Displacement in all levels.
- International level 4 is eligible to judge Group 4 FIG sanctioned events
- International level 3 is eligible to judge Group 2, 3 and 4 FIG sanctioned events
- a. International Events: See Appendix A

b. National Events (Canadian Championships & Elite Canada) Selection

- Candidates:

Provinces are responsible for naming the candidate(s) that will participate in these events. Allocation requests will be communicated by GymCan. Provinces may have the opportunity to send additional judges. FIG Judges who are named/requested by GymCan are eligible for funding from GymCan.

- GymCan Funding:

GymCan will determine the budget for the current competitive year



- Provincial Allocation:

- FIG judges will be required to submit event availability to the Judging Chairperson of Canada.
- The Canada Judging Chairperson will determine how many judges from each Province will be selected. This will be based on number of athletes registered from each Province for the event the previous year.
 - 1. If a Province is requested to send a judge and they have only one FIG judge available, this is judge who would be selected to attend the event.
 - 2. If a Province is requested to provide more than 5 judges, an additional judge **may** be selected for funding where possible.
 - 3. The host Province for the event: 1 additional judge may be selected if available.
 - 4. If there is a FIG Judge from a Province who was not requested to send a judge, this judge will be granted selection for at least one event per year.

- Priority order of selection is as follows:

- 1. Any judge who is FIG in all three (3) apparatus
- 2. Any judge who is FIG for two (2) apparatus + National in one (1) apparatus
- 3. Any judge who is FIG in two (2) apparatus
- 4. Any judge who is FIG in one (1) apparatus + National in two (2) apparatus
- 5. Any judge who is FIG in one (1) apparatus + National in one (1) apparatus
- 6. Any judge who is FIG in one (1) apparatus.

In the six (6) criteria above, if there is a judge who requires a National Competition to be eligible for an International event, they will have priority. If the event is FIG sanctioned, priority will be given to any judge that requires the event to maintain or upgrade current FIG level.

- Panel Constitution (judges with full-time availability)

- Junior/Senior Category will be comprised of: FIG except 1 DD (except synchro) + 2 HD (TRI)
- L5, L6, L7 categories will be comprised of: CJP (FIG), 1DD (FIG), 1 EX (FIG)
- Execution: The goal will be to have every Province represented on panels
- FIG judges who are receiving the GymCan grant will have at least six (6) panels (HD are not counted) during the event.
- All remaining FIG judges will have at least five (5) panels (HD are not counted)
- National Level judges will have at least four (4) panels (HD are not counted)
- Judge who are more certified in a specific discipline will be given priory to have more assignments on that discipline.
- Provinces who request for shared judge position will be responsible for changing those assignments (change must be approved by the Judging Chair of Canada). A FIG judge position cannot be substituted for a NAT judge position on a panel.



- HD (TRI) positions are filled in priority order as follows:
 - 1. Official TRI Nat judges (2 spots)
 - 2. Official TRI FIG judges (1 spot)
 - 3. All other judges available to fill remaining spots after all assignment are fulfilled.

NOTE: Any judge who plans departure times prior to the end of the event will not be assigned to any panels. This is especially the case if they do not respect the scheduled times listed as per the directives for the event.

c. 3rd Trial/Technical Trial

The decision to host a 3rd Trials will occur on a year-to-year basis. On years where a 3rd Trial will take place, it will always be necessary to keep costs as low as possible. In this case, a simplified panel can be used (Example: only 1 HD judge or DD Judge). The goal will be to prioritize judges who have FIG status in all the disciplines competing in the 3rd Trial and also to prioritize judges who will participate in World Championships and/or World Age Group Championships. One of the ways to keep costs manageable will be to consider competition location select local judges where possible. Where possible, each Province will be represented on the panel when Senior athletes are participating in the event.

d. Canada Winter Games (TRI and TRS only)

Canada Winter Games assignments are the responsibility of each Province. Provinces are required to build a selection process to select judges for this event, adhering to the following:

- Judge must be at least National Level
- Judge must have been active at National level the year prior to the Canada Games.
- Judge must be in good standing with both their Provincial and National Federation.

NOTE: Allocation is as follows: One judge is eligible to attend from each Province/Territory that participates in the Canada Games. The host Province is eligible to send one additional judge. This additional judge must be FIG.

e. Other International Competitions (Club Event or Provincial Tour Event)

If a Club/Province sends a team to an International event, they must make all attempts to fulfill the judge's participation requirement. In this case, the club/Province will be responsible for all fees required for the travelling judge, or the fine that is paid to the event organizing committee for failing to provide a judge. The Club/PTO is permitted to seek out a judge (who is eligible for the event) in their Club/Province. The Club/PTO is also permitted to seek assistance from the Judging Chair of Canada, if they cannot confirm a judge. The Judge Chair of Canada should be advised of the situation and process.



D. PROCESS DURING COMPETITION

- 1. Tasks and responsibilities for HD judges:
 - When there is no HD machine, HD judges will operate using an overhead camera that is on the competition floor. They will be sitting on the podium with the panel viewing a screen that shows the camera image. They are also responsible for timing the warm-up.
- 2. A superior judge should be named for each Domestic event. The superior judge will be responsible for score revisions, working with the discipline CJP (Chair of the Judging Panel). For National Domestic events, the Chair or an advisor will have this responsibility.
- 3. Scoring review
 - i. Execution: There are no situations in which a review for execution should be done.
 - ii. Horizontal displacement: There are no situations in which a review for HD should be done.
 - iii. CJP: A review can be requested. The review must be done at real speed, without using frozen images, slow motion or frame by frame video. The Superior jury can be requested to do a second review with the CJP.
 - iv. DD: A review may be requested. The review must be done at real speed, without using frozen images, slow motion or frame by frame video. The Superior jury can be requested to do a second review with the CJP.

E. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

a. Judging Chairperson of Canada

All interested candidates can be nominated through the GymCan nomination process. The Judging Chair of Canada is selected by an election. All current FIG Judges are entitled to 1 vote each. The Judging Chair of Canada is a member of the TTPC for a term of 3 years. Roles and Responsibilities:

- Manage all certifications to be an Official through P3 to P1 and from N3 to N1.
- Participate in all TTPC meetings and activities; collaborate with TTPC in decision making, selection documents, pathways, etc
- May be asked to sit on a TTPC Working group
- Manage communication between the FIG Judges, the Canada Judging Adviser and to the Provincial Judging Chairpersons.
- Clarify, distribute and post rules and documents related to all TG Sports
- Manage all National event Panels
- Approve all National event schedule
- Manage International Assignations
- a. Canada Judging Advisor(s) Process and Responsibilities:

All interested candidates submit their name to the Judging Chair of Canada and are voted upon by the FIG Judges every cycle. There will be 2 people named as Canada Judging Advisors, where possible: one from the East of Canada and the other from the West of Canada. These judges will act as adviser(s) to the Judging Chairperson of Canada. When needed, these individuals will be included in a working group with the Judging Chair of Canada. The FIG Judging council will be made up of the following:



- Judging Chair of Canada
- Eastern Canadian Judging Advisor
- Western Canadian Judging Advisor
- TG Program Manager
- TG National Team Director

Whenever required, this working group will be tasked with advising and consulting with the Judging Chair of Canada on various projects, such as judging documents, international assignment selection, etc

b. Provincial Judging Chairperson

These positions are filled by the Provinces and they have the responsibility to adhere to their set criteria to name the Chairperson.

APPENDIX A - PROCEDURES FOR SELECTION OF FIG BREVET JUDGES FOR EVENTS

For clarity, this document uses the following wording:

- LEVEL (Level of FIG Brevet Judge) identified by FIG 1, FIG 2, FIG 3 and FIG 4
- CATEGORY (Category of the competition) identified by CAT1, CAT2, CAT3, CAT4
- FIG judges' council
 - o Judging Chairperson of Canada: Sébastien Rajotte
 - o Western Canada Judging Advisor: Mary Pupo
 - o Eastern Canada Judging Advisor: Cassandra Siwek
 - o TG National Team Director: Karen Cockburn
 - o TG Program Manager: Niki Lavoie

There are a number of events in which GymCan will need to send FIG Brevet Judges as part of the Canadian Team. Canada's goal is to have as many high-level FIG Brevet Judges as possible to provide the best opportunity for Canadian FIG Brevet Judges and to support the growth of Trampoline Gymnastics in Canada.

To fulfill these requirements, the FIG Judges Council will review a variety of factors to provide the best opportunities for the FIG Judges. Consideration will also be given to circumstances that facilitate Canada to enable judges to meet the necessary requirements to sustain their level of brevet, move up a level, or be eligible to attend the Intercontinental Judging Course. A primary goal is to ensure Canada is in the best position for the cycle, but also to continuously look forward to future cycles and levels of Brevet Judges to maintain a solid core group of strong judges. The goals of GymCan include:

- Maximizing the development of FIG Brevet judges by assigning logical International judging opportunities to minimally ensure FIG Brevet judges maintain the same level. In the best scenario, giving them the opportunity to increase their level in the next cycle.
- When possible, GymCan will assist FIG Brevet judges to achieve their minimal number of International events by attempting to host a FIG sanctioned event in Canada every cycle.
- Avoid paying financial penalties for not sending a judge to an International event.

FIG 4 judges are eligible for CAT4 International Competition.

FIG 3 judges are eligible for CAT2, CAT3 and CAT4 International Competitions.

Pre-requisites for International Assignment process

In order to be eligible to be considered for the International Assignment process, all FIG Judges must be nationally active in the last two years with attendance of at least two national events. If the judge has not fulfilled this requirement, they will be required to write a letter to the FIG Judges Council and their respective Provincial Chairperson to indicate that they will be available for the two national events in the current year. The Provincial Chairperson will then be requested to send that judge to any national event the candidate is missing.

The FIG Brevet Judges should be in good standing with GymCan and with their PTO (including possessing up-to-date Safe Sport Requirements). Only judges who have not had any code of ethics or conduct violations for the current year will be considered. Any judge who is on probation will not be considered (procedure for handling code of conduct violations can be found in the link).



FIG Brevet Judging Assignments - International Events

- 1. Once the schedule of events is approved by GymCan, the FIG Judges Council will build the event schedule for the year and determine how many judges will be selected for each event.
- 2. The Judging Chair will distribute the Schedule of Events and the required level for each event to the FIG Brevet Judges requesting them to communicate their ability to attend each event. Judges will submit their preference and also indicate their priority for each assignment they select. The judge will be requested to indicate the maximum number of competitions they are available for in the year. The intent to participate in future Intercontinental courses will also be requested.
- 3. Upon receipt of all FIG Brevet Judges availability, the following criteria are taken into consideration by the FIG Judges Council to determine the assignments:
 - a) The event will contribute to the judge maintaining their current level (See Note 1 and Note 2)
 - b) The event will contribute to the judge upgrading to the next level (See Note 1, Note 2 and Note 3)
 - c) The number of out-of-country FIG assignments the judge participated in for the last three years
 - d) The percentage of events the judge applied for in the current assignment (See Note 4)
 - e) Eligibility of the judge to participate in Olympic Games when Canada is selected.
- 4. In the case where there is more than one candidate selected, the following criteria can be used as a tie breaker to help selecting the candidate
 - a) Judges' level
 - b) Judges' experience (from year of initial FIG brevet)
 - c) Judges' record for the last three years (sanction, assignment cancellation without a valid reason such as medical or family emergency reason)
 - d) Multi-discipline availability of the Judge for events hosting multiple events (usually applies to Pan American Championships and Indo-Pacific Championships)
 - e) Selected discipline by the judge

Note 1: Judges that upgrade their level during the current cycle will not have priority over a judge that follow the normal process.

Note 2: Judges that did not use the opportunity to fill a CAT4 requirement with our domestic events will not be prioritized for International CAT4 events.

Note 3: The intent given for the Intercontinental courses is also an aspect for the upgrade criteria **Note 4:** This is intended to specify the flexibility in the number of events a judge is available for, not the total number of events a judge is available for in a year.



GymCan Travel to International Events

Judges selected to be part of the GymCan team to an International event will be able to claim for the following expenses:

- Airport parking (for the duration of team travel)
- Mileage (event related only eg to and from airports)
- Taxis and Ubers (only when event related and when no LOC transport is provided)
- Meals for the duration of team travel (eg on travel days or when not provided by the LOC OR the LOC cannot accommodate for food allergies) (per diem)
- Visa required to enter the country

Any other expense must be approved by the TG Program Manager.

It is the expectation that judges make all attempts to keep their travel expenses to a minimum. It is important for our community to acknowledge that in some cases, event expenses (all or a portion) are cost-shared amongst the athletes.

GymCan will register all judges on assignment, book travel, accommodation, meal plan for the duration of the event, banquet tickets, all on-site local transportation (this will be organized by the LOC).

Proposed flight itineraries will be communicated as early as possible prior to an event. Judges will have 72 hours to confirm the itinerary or choose an alternate. In any case where a judge would like to book their own travel, they will be reimbursed a maximum amount for the flight cost, which will be communicated as early as possible. This maximum amount will be based on the maximum amount paid for group travel, for team members with the same departure airport as the judge. In the case where accommodation and meals have been booked with the LOC, through GymCan and a judge chooses to book their own accommodation outside of the LOC accommodation, they will be required to reimburse GymCan for the cost of the missed nights and will not be reimbursed for meals if they choose to not eat the meals provided by the LOC in the pre-paid meal plan.

Expense forms must be submitted no more than 2 weeks prior to returning home from the event. Expenses must include receipts where applicable. Any late expenses will not be paid, without special permission by the TG Program Manager and Judging Chair of Canada.



APPENDIX B — JUDGING VIRTUAL EVENTS

In the case where virtual events may be necessary to take the place of in-person events, the following appendix will outline the guidelines for best practices and procedures for judging such domestic competitions. More specific details will follow in the Guidelines to judging virtual events.

Videos should be sent to the Program Manager and or Superior Judge selected for the Event. Videos will need to be organized and categorized by discipline, gender and level.

- 1) During the time that athletes will be scheduled to compete in their clubs, a judge will be live on Zoom to be responsible for the items below, as well as: time the warm-up, be in charge of the touches, signaling of the athletes, maintaining start-lists, verify the code.
- 2) Judging will be conducted via Zoom so that all of the judges will see and judge the routines together, at the same time and send in their scores at the same time via zoom.
- 3) Results of the competition will be available 2 weeks after the event, to give the judging panels an appropriate amount of time to judge all routines.

Together, the judging panel will view the videos online and submit their scores, which will be inputted into the scoring software.

JUDGING PANEL

Role of the Superior Judge:

Equipment verification

Video quality verification

Verify the code was presented (video authenticity)

Camera quality and placement verification

Upon receiving video, ensuring TG PM also has access to the video

Once videos have been collected and sorted by level, the Superior judge will Chair the judging panel via zoom.

Selection of the Panel:

- Judges must be in good standing with both GymCan and their Provincial Sport Organization.
- Panels for each discipline will be created by the Judging Chairperson of Canada, along with the FIG Council.
- Judging levels and panel will comply with Canadian Judging Standards
