MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR AND PRESIDENT/CEO KATIE BIBERDORF AND SCOTT HAYES

2017-18 was yet another busy year for the Alberta Gymnastics Federation (AGF) with some outstanding high points as well as some challenges for the organization and the sport.

We have fully transitioned to online registration which has streamlined club registration for members and the office. Member clubs also completed the transition from ActiveNet to Amilia, which was a smooth process and is meeting the needs of clubs. A new service that AGF began to offer is Document Genius, which allows for the online storage of documents including waivers. Additional staff members were also on site at major events to oversee interviews and post to social media which resulted in a significant increase in activity on all platforms and further exposure for the sport. Various improvements to the AGF website were also made to offer new information and resources for members and the public. The hosting strategy has also proven successful in conducting various training camps, Zones, Trials, Provincials, Westerns and other events.

AGF also continued to excel at all our events. Whether they were competitive or recreational in nature, AGF members continued to shine and represent the Federation with respect and civility. On behalf of the Federation we would like to express our gratitude to the countless volunteers who gave their time to make our many events the success they were. We would also like to sincerely thank the AGF member clubs and their members, along with our corporate sponsors and suppliers, for their ongoing support and generosity.

As far as challenges this year, gymnastics was very much on the front page of the news with the various cases involving athlete maltreatment in Canada and the USA. AGF recognized immediately that additional action was required and work in creating our SafeSport program began. Additional support was secured, and increased resources committed to the development and implementation. Additionally, a SafeSport working group was implemented at the Board level, that will ensure the maintenance of a safe and healthy environment for all our members. AGF continues to review and update our policies in this area as well as the process associated with our Disciplinary policy.

The past year also saw continued changes to the provincial office staff with new faces bringing new perspectives and energy to our continued push to implement and adhere to our Strategic Plan. We would once again like to thank the Board, staff, and our members for your continued support and assistance over this past year. AGF continues to grow as an organization and we could not do this without you and our team approach. It continues to be our honour to serve and represent the Alberta Gymnastics Community in our roles of Chair and President/CEO.

We are all passionate about our sport, and together we can make a difference.







GYMNASTICS FOR ALL

Throughout the 2017-2018 season, there were many highlights in the Gymnastics For All (GFA) program from varying events and developments in our current programs.

The season kicked off with Rec Retreat. Coaches, presenters, and members of the GFA Committee met from across the province at Pine Valley to learn, laugh, and recharge over a weekend of activities and workshops. 22 coaches came together over learning opportunities in the gym that could be applied in their own programs. They also connected over social activities including a campfire under the stars.

AGF's annual Awards Gala took place on October 14, 2017 at the River Cree Resort & Casino in Edmonton. The GFA community celebrated a record number of award recipients, with 9 CANGYM Gold Badges, 7 Exceptional Athletes, 13 Outstanding Coaches, 7 Volunteers, and 3 Performance Groups.

Through the mentorship program, 2 aspiring career coaches expanded their skills in conjunction with the expertise of other coaches around Alberta. Positive reviews were shared from both mentors and mentees, as the value of learning from each other's experiences was consistently maintained.

Gymfest's theme of "Blast Into The Future" successfully launched from May 12-13 at the Saville Centre in Edmonton, where 395 athletes and 59 coaches participated in 29 performances and 8 workshops. Canadian Gymnaestrada followed from June 28-July 1 with 400 athletes and 41 coaches from Alberta celebrating their interpretations of "Diversity Through Movement" in performances that took place in Richmond, BC's Olympic Oval and outdoors during Steveston Village's Salmon Festival.

The first phase of the revitalized CANGYM program was piloted in the Spring of 2018, in which the Core Fundamentals curriculum was covered. The technical team is working to provide additional curriculum to pilot clubs and is looking to run an Active Start pilot phase in January 2019. CANJUMP has also been in the process of being updated and is set to be completed and in circulation near the end of 2018.

AGF's social media presence has continued expanding to help profile the sport and maintain ongoing communication and transparency with members. Instagram, Facebook and Twitter have all seen steady growth in followers, reach and engagement.

To all the staff, committee members, coaches, parents, and supporters, AGF would like to formally thank you for everything you do for the GFA community. The positive learning environment we provide for children would not be possible without all your efforts.



ACROBATIC GYMNASTICS

It was another great year for Acrobatics in Alberta with growth in membership, participation and local events. Our growth was most notable at this year's Provincial Championships where we had a full judging panel. Alberta athletes from Calgary Acro were also the first Acro athletes from Canada to ever place in the top 4 at a World Championships with this year's event taking place in Belgium.

Clubs

Alberta clubs with an astounding 121 registered athletes (an increase from 90 in 2016/17) offered competitive ACRO gymnastics programs.

Training Opportunities

Alberta hosted an athlete training camp and coach's clinic with guest clinician Bethany Miller from England. Miller is the coach of European and World Champion Silver medalists and the youngest member of the Great Britain coaching team to attend both trips.

Judging Courses

The Judging Technical Chair developed Alberta's first judging courses creating 5 new registered judges in the Province.

WOMEN'S ARTISTIC GYMNASTICS

The 2017-2018 competitive season has been a very busy yet successful season for our WAG program. The women's program continues to grow and improve within our province and the country. Some highlights include; growing developmental and competitive numbers through the Junior Olympic (JO) Program, more coaches obtaining certification at all levels, strong representation of Alberta Teams at Westerns and Canadians, and additional judges moving into the National and Brevet Systems.

Clubs

50 clubs are now registered in the AGF Women's Competitive Program.

Training Camps

AGF hosted 2 JO training camps this year and the Canadians Team Training Camp. Expert Coaches from across Alberta came to present at the JO camps. The JO 1-3 Camp was an overnight camp hosted at the Pine Valley Gymnastics Centre and the JO 5-8 Camp was a day long camp hosted at Artistique Gymnastics in Lacombe. The Alberta Teams attending Canadians trained together at the Calgary Gymnastics Centre over a 2-day training camp before Canadians.

Judge Development

Alberta registered 73 judges this season from Brevet to Compulsory judges. We offered 8 provincial level judging courses as well as a FIG course. In addition, we offered 2 Head Judging courses and 2 Ethics in Judging Courses. Another focus was on providing professional development opportunities for the judges.

MEN'S ARTISTIC GYMNASTICS

The 2017-2018 competitive season was a busy year for the MAG program in Alberta, with athletes, coaches and judges attending many local events. The year was spent mostly on our domestic competitions and training camps. There were 319 (up approx. 59 from last year) total registered athletes; 286 in the Provincial Pathway, 33 in the Elite Pathway.

Clubs

16 Alberta clubs are registered with AGF with a men's competitive gymnastics program.

Judging Courses

Alberta had a total of 23 active judges in the province including 5 FIG judges. 2 webinar-based courses – developed by Jamie Ellacott – were offered this year; one entry level course with 8 participants, and one regional level course with 5 participants.

Provincial Pathway

The provincial program was busy with 6 invitational meets across the province, as well as Provincial Championships in Red Deer and Western Canadian Championships in Spruce Grove, Alberta. A Provincial and Elite level training camp was hosted at Gymtastics in Calgary with 67 participants. A Canada Winter Games training camp was also hosted at the Calgary Gymnastics Centre for prospective Alberta athletes of the 2019 Games.

Elite Pathway

There were approximately 33 athletes in the Elite Stream Pathway; many participated in invitational's, training camps and provincial trials ranging from GymPower in Edmonton and the U of C International Cup in Calgary to Canadians, Westerns and Provincial Championships.


