# ANNUAL REPORT 2021 – 2022 ACRO

The past season presented many opportunities and challenges for Acro; however, the resilience, dedication, and collaboration from our Acro Community made the experience for our Acrobats very positive in being able to train and compete with their teammates once again.

Over the past year, the Acro Technical Assembly (ATA) has met every month to share perspectives, create strategies, and delegate tasks to both provide the best possible experience for our existing athletes, as well as exploring new strategies to educate clubs and attract new participants to our sport. The commitment to growing the sport of Acro from every member of the ATA cannot go unnoticed, as they truly are the reason we are able to foster this emerging sport.

Throughout Summer and Fall, our Acrobats returned to the gym and reacclimated themselves to both their regular routine of training, as well as within their partnerships. During this period, we also revitalized our Acro Coach Mentorship program, and provided learning opportunities for 3 coaches that would carry on throughout the season.

Leading up to our competitive season, we held a training camp and mock meet to allow our Acrobats and Judges to prepare for the competitions to come later in the year. The camp was well attended from participants across the province, and also included groups from our neighbours in Saskatchewan.

As the season progressed, our Acrobats put in a great deal of effort in which they were rewarded with an overall increased level of stability, execution, and performance. Nearing the close of our Provincial Competitive Calendar, we hosted the Western Alliance Acro Cup, and had groups from BC and Alberta come together to support each other and compete in what was a truly spectacular event.

Nationally, we had multiple groups from Edmonton Acro and Salto represent Alberta at the 2022 Virtual Acro Canadian Championships, which resulted in several medals being collected including golds in the Level 9 and Youth Women's Group categories, silvers in the Women's Pair (11-16) and Women's Group Youth categories, and bronzes in the Women's Group (11-16), Level 7 (14+), and Youth categories. Internationally, we had two groups from Calgary Acro proudly represent Canada at the 2022 FIG Acrobatic Gymnastics World Age Group Competitions.

Taking a look back from where we had started to where the season has taken us, it is remarkable to see the progression and growth from our Acro Community in such a short amount of time. We are excited to continue to grow with the highly anticipated C1 Acro Course and upcoming workshops to educate clubs about how to start an Acro program, as we are committed to continue to grow the sport of Acro in Alberta and Canada.

AGF is so appreciative for the 5 Acro clubs, 22 coaches, 98 acrobats, 8 judges, and numerous volunteers, ATA members, and supporters of Acro in Alberta. We are so excited to see this emerging sport continue to grow and can't wait to see what the 2022-2023 season brings!



# ANNUAL REPORT 2021 – 2022 GFA

The past season was such a positive year for our clubs as we were able to fully invite our participants back to our clubs following disruptions from COVID-19. Getting our GFA Programs back up and running and providing opportunities for our coaches to do what they love was the number one priority at the start of the season, and from that point, the momentum built as classes filled up, and our sense of normalcy was re-established.

The start of the 2021-2022 season still had moments of uncertainty; however, our community pulled together and made the most out of what we had. In partnership with Gymnastics BC, we ran a virtual GFA Retreat with educational workshops to provide professional development opportunities for our coaches, which was very well attended.

Continuing the theme of creating value that is accessible by our community, we took a revitalized approach to our GFA Coaches Mentorship Program, where we had our mentors create a virtual classroom setting that would allow for coaches from across the participant to come together to an inclusive learning environment. The results were fantastic and the lessons learned and impact on our community reached new levels that were not possible from past mentorship strategies.

Recognizing that there was a need to continue innovating and providing opportunities for our clubs, AGF collaborated with coaches from within our own community to establish a formal Parkour Program that would be turn-key for clubs to access a potentially new market and provide more opportunities to bring more participants into their clubs. This included both a curriculum that used modern technology to make the content easy to use and accessible, as well as a coaching course that is currently in the progress of becoming recognized by the Coaching Association of Canada to become an NCCP course that can be delivered across the country.

Our Gymnaestrada teams had a fantastic year of events as we hosted both Gymfest and Canadian Gymnaestrada within a few months of each other, which provided a great foundation for our experienced and brand-new teams to perform, participate in workshops, and most importantly, have fun! With World Gymnaestrada being held in Amsterdam in 2023, we are excited to share that Alberta makes up a large part of the Canadian delegation, and are excited to have our teams experience this amazing celebration of gymnastics, dance, and movement.

AGF is so appreciative of the 71 clubs, 578 coaches, 33,914 participants, and countless volunteers, committee members, and supporters of Gymnastics in Alberta. We are so excited to continue growing and sharing the sport we all love, and look forward to an even better 2022-2023!



# ANNUAL REPORT

2021 - 2022 MAG

After 2 years on and off due to COVID-19 the 2021-2022 competitive season was a full and successful season for the MAG program in Alberta. This season included two trial events and Provincial Championships, all of which were located in Edmonton. With Canada Winter Games being around the corner we sent a team to BC to compete in a mock Canada Winter Games event against BC and SK. There were 218 total registered athletes: 157 in the Provincial Pathway, 54 in the Elite Pathway.

#### Clubs

16 Alberta clubs are registered with AGF with a men's competitive gymnastics program.

#### **Judging Courses**

Alberta had a total of 31 registered MAG judges in the province of which 22 actively judged in the last year. This includes 7 FIG judges who successfully passed the international course and exam for this new Olympic Cycle (2 new judges certified in this cycle). Chris Grabowecky and Mark Heiderich ran an online introductory course for those new to Men's Gymnastics judging. It was well attended with a number of new prospective judges and parents participating.

Gymnastics Canada offers a beginner online MAG judging course anyone can take it at any time. Additionally, Gymnastics Canada offers a Club level course that can be taken by any judges who have experience at the entry level already. The Provincial judging chairs and Gymnastics Canada are collaborating to develop a virtual course and exam to certify new National Level judges for those who wish to advance to that level. This will be offered in November 2022. This same course material will likely be used to certify judges at the Provincial Level at a future date.

In addition to the judging courses, 4 of our current FIG judges attended international competitions representing Gymnastics Canada.

#### **Provincial Pathway**

The provincial program saw two trial meets as well as Provincial Championships, all which were in Edmonton, AB. An Alberta Canada Winter Games selection event was hosted at Gymtastics and Calgary Gymnastics Centre, followed by a mock CWG event competing against BC and SK at Twisters Invitational BC.

#### **Elite Pathway**

There were approximately 44 athletes in the Elite Stream Pathway; many participated at Provincial trials (Spruce Moose Invitational in Spruce Grove, Salto Gymnastics Challenge in Edmonton) to Canadians, Westerns and Provincial Championships.

### **Domestic Competitions**

Alberta athletes competed in Alberta Provincial Championships (Edmonton, Alberta – April), Western Canadian Championships (Winnipeg, Manitoba - April), Canadian Championships (Richmond, BC – May). Alberta won numerous medals in individual events at all of the competitions. Participation in these events included:

- 1) Provincial Championships 158 Provincial and Elite stream athletes took part at the Provincial Championships in Edmonton, Alberta.
- 2) Westerns 28 Athletes competed at the Western Canadian Championships in Winnipeg, Manitoba winning 2 Gold, 1 Silver, and 1 Bronze medal in the Team events; 1 Gold, 2 Silver 3 Bronze in the All-Around categories and 30 medals in the Event Finals.
- **3) Canadians** 19 athletes competed at the Canadian Championships in Richmond, BC. For highlights, please see below for the results.

# ANNUAL REPORT 2021 – 2022 WAG

The 2021-2022 competitive season has been a very busy and successful season for our WAG program. The women's program continues to grow and improve within our province and the country. This year, AGF introduced the Xcel program across Alberta and hosted the first Alberta Xcel Championships. We continue to see more coaches being certified at all levels, strong representation of Alberta Teams at Westerns and Canadians, and additional judges moving into the National and Brevet Systems.

#### Clubs

We currently have 40 clubs registered with AGF with a Women's Competitive Program.

#### **Training Camps**

AGF hosted 4 Canadian Competitive Program training camps this year as well as the Canadians Team Training Camp. Expert Coaches from across Alberta and guest presenters from Canada came to present at the camps. There were two CCP 3-5 camps held in the fall, one in the north and one in the south. The level 8-10 camp and the level 6-7 camp were both 2-day camps with over 80 athletes registered in each camp, both camps filled up in under a day!

#### **Judges Development**

Alberta registered 62 judges this season from Brevet to Compulsory judges. All compulsory judges were required to complete a course this year due to the changes in the Code of Points. We hosted multiple online courses to certify judges as well as to help judge earn CPE hours. Congratulations to all of our Brevet judges (Sheri Wilson, Brady Spencer, Cynthya Bringas-Soriano, and Sarah Shaver) for passing their FIG exam for this cycle.

# **Competitions**

Alberta athletes competed in the Alberta Provincial Championships (Edmonton – April), Western Canadian Championships (Winnipeg, Manitoba - April), Alberta Xcel Championships (Edmonton – April), Alberta Compulsory Championships (Lethbridge – May) Canadian Championships (Richmond, B.C. – May). Alberta won numerous medals in individual and team events. Participation in these events included:

- 1) Trials to Westerns Hosted by the Precision Gymnastics Club with over 120 athletes in levels 8-10 and Aspire.
- 2) Alberta Provincial Championships Almost 350 athletes from levels 6-10 and Aspire competed at Provincials hosted by Ortona Gymnastics Club.
- 3) Alberta Xcel Championships Over 250 athletes attended the first Xcel Championships hosted by Capital City Gymnastics
- 4) Alberta Compulsory Championships -Over 275 athletes attended the Compulsory Championships hosted by West Wind Gymnastics
- 5) Westerns 48 athletes competed at the Western Canadian Championships
- 6) Canadians 26 athletes competed at the Canadian Championships
